




MARCH 2019 NEWSLETTER TAPL SEA COMMITTEE & SCHOLARSHIP ENDOWMENT UPDATE

DIRECTOR'S REPORT FOR THE AMERICAN ASSOCIATION OF PROFESSIONAL LANDMEN

The AAPL Quarterly Board Meeting was held at the Encore Resort in Las Vegas, Nevada on March 10, 2019. The following notes are only a portion of the meeting.

AAPL DIRECTOR'S REPORT: QUARTERLY BOARD MEETING REVIEW (Continued)

Financials

The following are accounts associated with the AAPL and the dollar amounts as of 12/31/18:

- Total Assets = \$33,164,684
 - \$28,121,084 of the Total Assets are comprised of cash and cash equivalents
- AAPL, Inc's Investment Accounts = \$25,143,104
- AAPL Educational Foundation, Inc. = \$3,878,036
- Landman Scholarship Trust = \$6,886,448

All of the investment accounts have lost some amount of value from 9/30/18 due to the downturn in the market; however, a more current view of the investments shows that we have rebounded to similar balances on 9/30/18 in 2019.

Committee and Other Items to Note

- Nominating Committee released the officers to be voted on by the membership. AAPL members should be get an email to vote by the middle of March 2019. The following are those who will be on the ballot:
 - President: Jay W. Beavers, CPL
 - 1st Vice President: Lester A. Zitkus, CPL
 - 2nd Vice President: Wendy G. Dalton, CPL
 - 3rd Vice President: Sean W. Marshall, CPL
 - Treasurer: Jason T. Maloy, CPL
 - Secretary: Britney Crookshanks, CPL
- Contract Center's price has been decreased to \$250 per year (originally \$375) for members. Currently has 307 users.
- <u>Tulsa University's MEB program has been fully accredited by the AAPL. Congrats TU!</u>
- At the Annual Meeting in Pittsburgh, AAPL Membership will vote to change the bylaws to eliminate the requirement for a sponsor if someone wants to become an Associate Member.
- The Board of Directors approved spending \$180,000 to produce 16 new ethics videos. These videos should be made available to the membership in the next 3-4 months. The topics will include conflict of interest, fraud, gender bias, sexual harassment, forgery, duty to disclose, substance abuse, and misuse/commingling of funds to name a few.
- Did you know? AAPL will provide up to \$300 per educational event, twice a year per member in reimbursement. There is no "need" base requirement for the reimbursement and any active member in good standing can apply.
- Oklahoma: Senator Brooks introduced a bill in the Oklahoma Senate (SB 514) that has caused some concern for Landmen that testify in front of the OCC. Several parties have expressed their concerns for the bill, and Senator Brooks has indicated that he will not push the bill forward.
- Ohio licensing issue: The Ohio Supreme Court ruled that Landmen working in Ohio must be a licensed realtor. HOWEVER, Landmen have received an exception. In order to practice, Ohio requires that Landmen must register with the Ohio Department of Commerce. The required forms are in development.
- Colorado: Several congressmen are trying to pass legislation in Colorado that would essentially transfer the regulation of the oil and gas industry from the state level to the city/town level. There is a big concern for this bill and AAPL is actively involved in this.


MARCH 2019 NEWSLETTER MARCH EDUCATIONAL LUNCHEON RECAP
