Texas RRC Issues New Regulations on Fracking Disposal Wells

New regulations covering disposal wells from fracking operations go into effect in Texas beginning in November 2014. The new regulations by the Texas Railroad Commission (Texas RRC, or Commission), the state's regulating entity for oil and gas, are centered on the possible linkage between seismic activity and disposing wells.

There are four main components of the new regulations:

- Applicants for disposal wells must conduct a search on the U.S. Geological Survey seismic database to determine if there is a history of earthquakes within a 100-square-mile area around the site of the proposed disposal well
- Clarify that the Commission will have the authority to suspend or terminate a disposal well permit if there is any indication from scientific data that seismic activity in the area could occur due to the disposal well
- Under the new regulations, disposal well operators will have to disclose annual reported volumes and pressures more frequently if the Commission determines that there is a need for the information
- The applicant of the disposal well will be required to provide information to the Commission to demonstrate
 that disposal fluids will be confined when the well is located in an area with conditions making the migration
 of fluids likely

The Texas RRC noted that it was taking proactive steps, just as it did in the past on disclosing chemicals used in hydraulic fracturing, well integrity requirements, and water-recycling rules.

"Once again, the Texas Railroad Commission is taking the lead in ensuring our rules follow science in protecting our natural resources while at the same time providing a stable regulatory environment for our oil and gas operators," Chairman Christi Craddick said in a statement.

A definitive link between disposal wells and seismic activity has yet to be determined, according to the Texas RRC. However, a study in Ohio recently linked earthquakes in the state to certain parts of the fracking operation, according to the digital publication Live Science. And in North Texas, citizens of Denton will be voting next month on an ordinance banning fracking within city limit, according to State Impact, a National Public Radio energy and environmental reporting project for Texas.



Halliburton to buy Baker Hughes for \$34.6B

HOUSTON – Halliburton will buy Baker Hughes for \$34.6 billion in a cash and stock transaction that marks one of the biggest oil-field services mergers ever.

The companies announced Monday that Baker Hughes investors will get 1.2 shares in Halliburton and \$19 in cash for each share they own. That values Baker Hughes at \$78.62 a share, a 31 percent premium over Friday's closing price. Baker Hughes investors would own 36 percent of the combined entity after the deal closes, expected in the second half of 2015.

News of the deal comes a few days after Baker Hughes confirmed it was talking to Halliburton about a potential deal, which caused shares to soar. Talks turned hostile Friday when Halliburton informed its rival it would make a run at its board in April if Baker Hughes didn't accept its offer.

Analysts say the two will have significant antitrust hurdles to deal with, and will likely have to spin off, sell or divest in part of their businesses including well cementing, logging-while-drilling tools that capture subterranean data, and engines that control the direction of underground drilling paths. That will almost certainly result in job cuts.

Halliburton said it agreed to divest businesses that make up to \$7.5 billion in revenue if antitrust authorities require it, but it said it expects that amount to be significantly less. It also agreed to pay Baker Hughes a \$3.5 billion break-up fee if the deal falls through.

Halliburton and Baker Hughes, the second and third biggest oil field service companies in the world, have 15,000 employees in Houston and 136,000 around the world. They said the combination would result in \$2 billion in cost savings and revenue increases. Combined 2013 revenues were \$51.8 billion.

They said the price tag represents a 40.8 percent premium over Baker Hughes shares on Oct. 10, the business day before Halliburton made its first offer. Halliburton will pay for the mega deal with both cash in its coffers and with debt.

The deal "will create a bellwether global oilfield service company," said Dave Lesar, chairman and CEO of Halliburton, in a written statement. The company will be "a Houston-based global oilfield services champion, manufacturing and exporting technologies, and creating jobs and serving customers around the globe."

The companies said the new business will keep the name Halliburton and will remain headquartered in Houston. Its New York Stock Exchange ticker will remain "HAL." Halliburton said it withdrew its slate of nominees for Baker Hughes' board of directors. Lesar will lead the company as chairman, president and CEO. Three of Baker Hughes' directors will join an expanded, 15-member Halliburton board after the deal closes.

"By combining two great companies that have delivered cutting-edge solutions to customers in the worldwide oil and gas industry for more than a century, we will create a new world of opportunities to advance the development of technologies for customers," Baker Hughes CEO Martin Craighead said in a written statement.

They said the combination will allow them to reach customers in every facet of the global oil and gas industry, in shale plays and in the deep-water oil fields. It will boost its business in the Eastern Hemisphere. Much of the synergies they expect to collect will come from "operational improvements" in North America, "personnel reorganization and other more efficient operations.

Baker Hughes shares surged upward \$9.31 in pre-market trading Monday to \$69.20 on the New York Stock Exchange. Halliburton shares fell \$2.62 in pre-market trading to \$52.46.
