LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD



Leo Kantowski was awarded TAPL's highest honor of the Lifetime Achievement Award during the April dinner meeting. In case you missed it, here are a few more things you might not know about him.





Leo grew up in Norman, OK in a loving family where as a young man he learned the important life lessons of working hard and playing well with others. In school he showed great potential academically and excelled in athletics. After a stellar high school football career, Leo joined the nationally ranked University of Oklahoma Sooner football team as a

walk-on offensive lineman. It was during this period that Leo began to develop exceptional risk-reward judgement skills. After a season on the scout team blocking against several All-American and future NFL defensive linemen. Leo made the fateful and wise decision to focus on the pursuit of his Petroleum Land Management degree. Upon graduation with said degree in May 1979 Leo launched a long and impactful career with stints as a Landman at Sun Oil, Grace Petroleum, and Valero in Dallas and Oklahoma City. At the low of the mid-80's oil bust Leo accepted a position with Kaiser Francis Oil Company in Tulsa in December 1985, where he contributed in a variety of capacities and worked multiple basins for over 18 years. In April 2004 Leo joined cross-town rival Samson where he has served for 17 years in positions of increasing responsibility, eventually ascending to General Manager of Land. As a key contributor during a period of tremendous company growth, Leo ran large-scale leasing programs, negotiated numerous joint ventures and legal agreements, and closed large numbers of asset deals of all shapes and sizes. Leo currently shepherds all Land processes for Samson Energy and the Schusterman Family interests. Throughout his career Leo has been known for his work ethic, tough but fair deal making, and depth of Land and contract knowledge. He's been a mentor to countless Landmen starting their careers and a resource to any who reach out seeking Land advice.....you just might have to discuss a little OU football before you get to any Land talk. Away from work Leo enjoys a taking in a variety of sports, sipping good whiskey, and travelling with his beloved wife, Laura. 




SPRING SCRAMBLE
