ASK THE ATTORNEY

ASK THE ATTORNEY BY: JACOB CHARNEY CHARNEY BROWN, LLC

Welcome to "Ask the Attorney." This new monthly segment will provide TAPL members an opportunity to get their energy related legal questions answered—without that hefty legal bill. Whether you have a unique title issue or just a general legal question, this segment will provide you guidance. Each month I will select one submitted inquiry and provide an analysis.

QUESTION:

Frank Oilman was the sole surface and mineral owner of the E/2 NE/4. In 1922, Mr. Oilman executed a mineral deed in favor of Samantha Gasman, transferring an undivided 20-acre mineral interest underlying the E/2 NE/4. Subsequently, in 1940, Ms. Gasman executed a mineral deed conveying 5 of her 10 net mineral acres to John Drilling and Fran Acking, in equal shares. In 1955, a resale tax deed is recorded wherein the County conveyed to Jeffrey Skilling all of the E/2 NE/4. It is stated in this resale tax deed that Mr. Oilman had previously failed to pay the ad valorem taxes. Did the resale tax deed vest Mr. Skilling with 100% of the surface and minerals underlying the E/2 NE/4?

ANSWER:

Yes....most likely the 1955 resale tax deed vested Mr. Skilling with 100.0% of the surface and 100.0% of the minerals underlying the E/2 NE/4.

In 1979, the Oklahoma legislature enacted 68 O.S § 3119 which states:

"A resale tax deed shall convey only the surface and surface rights and mineral interests owned by the owners of the surface rights as distinguished from mineral and mineral rights of such real property. The resale tax deed shall not convey any other interest owned by any other individual or legal entity."

The enactment of this statute appears to recognize that it is unfair to a severed mineral owner to divest them of their interest due to the failure of the surface owner to pay their property tax. However, this statute <u>did not become law</u> until 1979 and it cannot be applied retroactively. Therefore, we need to look at the law prior to the 1979 enactment of 68 O.S § 3119.

Prior to 1979, Oklahoma law held that a resale tax deed operates to convey to the tax deed purchaser not only the surface interest in the property, but also the mineral interest. This is **regardless** of if some of the mineral interests happen to be severed from the surface! This rule came from *Secrest v. Williams*, 94 P.2d 252, 253-54 (Okla. 1939), wherein the Oklahoma Supreme Court held that "the sale of land for taxes passes title to the land, including the mineral rights, therein, whether severed or not, to the purchaser, and therefore extinguishes the rights of the owner or owners of the land and of the mineral rights of any interest or estate therein." Therefore, under Oklahoma law, the 1955 resale tax deed would have conveyed all of the surface and all of the minerals to Mr. Skilling.

Of course there is an exception to the rule (there is always an exception!), which is why my answer is "Yes....most likely...." A resale tax deed will not convey the mineral interests, if there is production of the minerals in question, and gross production taxes were being paid on the produced minerals at the time of the default for non-payment of the ad valorem tax. This exception was set forth *McNaughton v. Beattie*, 75 P.2d 400, 401 (Okla. 1937), wherein the Oklahoma Supreme Court held "[w]here gross production tax has been paid on oil or gas produced from the land conveyed by resale tax deed, issued pursuant to a levy of ad valorem taxes, after discovery and during production of oil or gas and payment of said gross production tax, said tax deed does not convey the mineral rights in said land, even though the title to the mineral and surface are united in one party." To know if this exception applied to the question at hand, further facts would need to be provided concerning production and payments of gross production taxes.
